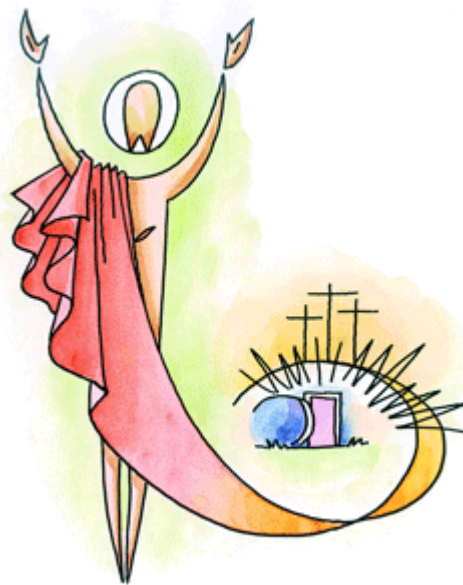
## Principal's Message

April can be a tough month for Vanier students and teachers alike. It's a transition season for physical activities – there's not enough snow for the winter activities and it's too soggy for the summer ones. I am grateful that Ms. Trainor and Mr. Craigen took a leadership role in planning this trip and to Mr. Connell who started this opportunity for our students.
